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

### LIMITLESS LEARNING Introducing Spaulding's New Podcast



In early November, Charley Suter, our director of technology and innovation, recorded conversations for the first episode of our brand-new podcast called "The Limitless Learning Podcast." The podcast launched on Spotify on Monday, December 23, 2024 and Charley and his team, including Digital Learning Assistant Brendan Donahue, are looking forward to airing new episodes monthly.

Charley and co-host Garrett Lavallee have been dreaming of doing a podcast for years, but we never quite had the space or equipment at Spaulding to turn those dreams into reality. The newly created Innovation Room solved the space problem, and our former director of human resources donated equipment to get the project rolling. Additional investments in microphones, cables and software got the effort up and running with capacity to speak to guests both in person and remotely.

"It was incredible to hear the impact that Choose Love has had on a young person's life. Through the podcast, Spaulding is providing an opportunity once again — for more connection with one another. Thank you for having me as part of it," she said.

The podcast is the result of brainstorming across all Spaulding departments about motivating topics. Our goal is to create engaging content to share with other educators and the community to educate, inspire and connect. In the future we hope to have students take an active role creating podcasts and utilizing math, science and language skills in the process. ## Spaulding Meets Rigorous Standards to Earn CARF Recertification

accreditor of health and human services organizations.

Spaulding must be accredited to receive state and federal funding, but the importance of recertifying goes far beyond just checking off a requirement. Carol says it best when she explains that CARF "comes in as a partner to guide you to being the best organization you can be."

Through on-site visits; surveys with all constituents, including staff, parents and students; and written reports submitted by Spaulding, CARF ensures that we are providing child and youth services safely, effectively and to the highest performance standards. Every aspect of our organization — from the services we provide,



to fiscal policies, communications, succession planning and more — is examined as part of the review.

Spaulding is proud to receive CARF recertification for the next three years, but that doesn't mean that we can rest on our laurels. We provide annual reports to retain accreditation — a job that Carol welcomes because it provides an opportunity to step back and look at how all aspects of our organization come together to fulfill our mission. "It is easy to focus on the day-to-day. The CARF accreditation process ensures that we regularly take a global view of Spaulding's operations and how they work together," she said.
